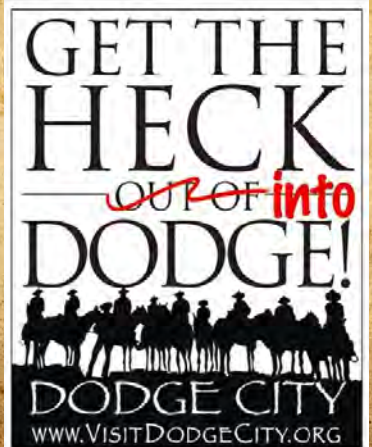

# WANTED

## OBJECTIVES

1. Understand the justification, influencing factors and applications of inhaled drug therapy
2. Become familiar with aerosol device principles and the importance of particle size and patient technique
3. Discuss the rationale for airway clearance and the mechanism of action of High Frequency Chest Wall Oscillation
4. Understand the indications, contraindications and warnings, for the use of CoughAssist
5. Discuss management and treatment options of patients with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)
6. Discuss the advances made in the resuscitation of infants
7. List the symptoms of OSA and describe association between OSA and CVD along with treatment options
8. List categories of shock and emphasize early detection and rapid intervention for shock
9. Understand mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery from All-Hazards disaster and understand the resources of the Center for Domestic Preparedness
10. Discuss the indications for body cooling in the neonatal population along with the physiologic changes neonates undergo during body cooling
11. Identify patients "at risk" for airway & ventilation compromise and recognize signs and symptoms of "impending" or actual airway emergencies
12. Identify current standards of practice for rapid trauma assessment while identifying airway/respiratory system management priorities in the multiple or poly-trauma patient
13. Identify adjunctive airway devices at the disposal of the Respiratory Care Practitioner. Observe "new" devices at the disposal of the Respiratory Care Practitioner for difficult airway patients
14. Identify modes of ventilation in current practice for the multi-systems trauma patient
15. Experience how it feels to take ownership in healthy relationships to create a learning and caring environment with honest communication, visibility, and trust.
