Fernando Martinez, MDProfessor of Pediatrics and Director of the Arizona Respiratory Center

Dr. Martinez is Director of the Specialized Center of Research in

Cellular and Molecular Mechanisms of Asthma at the University of Arizona. His major research interests include the natural history of childhood asthma, the genetic epidemiology of asthma and related conditions, and the early development of the immune system as a risk factor for the development of asthma. He is also the Director of one of five centers participating in the Childhood Asthma Research and Education (CARE) Network funded by NHLBI, and is a recipient of two other NIH grants.

Kurt Elward, MD, MPH, FAAFP Family Practitioner and NIH Research Service Award Recipient Charlottesville, Virginia

Dr. Elward is the AAFP representative to the National Asthma Education and Prevention Program (NAEPP) Coordinating Committee. The Committee will implement revised asthma guidelines to be published in 2006.
